Independent Practitioner's Review Engagement Report



To the Members and Chief and Council of the Ojibway Nation of Saugeen:

We have reviewed the accompanying Schedule of Remuneration and Expenses - Unelected Senior Officials of the Ojibway Nation of Saugeen and a summary of significant accounting policies (together "the Schedule") for the year ended March 31, 2022. The Schedule has been prepared by management of the Ojibway Nation of Saugeen based on Section 7.3 of the Indigenous Services Canada Financial Reporting Requirements.

Management's Responsibility for the Schedule

Management of the Ojibway Nation of Saugeen is responsible for the preparation of the Schedule in accordance with the provisions Section 7.3 of the Indigenous Services Canada Financial Reporting Requirements, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the Schedule that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Practitioner's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the Schedule based on our review. We conducted our review in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements, which require us to comply with relevant ethical requirements.

A review of the Schedule in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements is a limited assurance engagement. The practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making inquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less in extent than, and vary in nature from, those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on this Schedule.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the Schedule is not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with Section 7.3 of the Indigenous Services Canada Financial Reporting Requirements.

Basis of Accounting

Without modifying our conclusion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the Schedule, which describes the basis of accounting. The Schedule is prepared to assist the Ojibway Nation of Saugeen to meet the requirements of the provisions of Section 7.3 of the Indigenous Services Canada Financial Reporting Requirements. As a result, the Schedule may not be suitable for another purpose.
